Whilst there is theological debate as to when any concept of 'ascension' may have taken place, its position in most traditions – some forty or so days after Easter – allows us to have enjoyed the richness of all the post-Easter 'resurrection' stories, and seen – through the writings of Acts – the formation of this new and vibrant faith. A faith that is now our responsibility to manage, encourage, and formulate. Christ's work on earth is done. We have received all but the last link in the chain of faith's initial evolution. Now Christ will, as promised, release the overwhelming power of His Spirit through the imagery of Pentecost. It is now up to us! It is our job. It is our faith, born out of God's ultimate expression of love, his Son Jesus Christ, and planted firmly into the hearts and minds of each of us. Ascensiontide provides a time to activate those minds, and feel strength in those hearts ... and be reflections of that Son.

This short liturgy is designed to be used in your own homes — and we hope that it will be of use to you at this time. You can share it as a family around your kitchen-table as it is perfectly shaped to include a cup of coffee and your PJs! You can sit quietly by yourself, and ponder its words. However you use it, pause and remember the rest of our Church community at this time — and look forward to a time of celebration when we will indeed be together again ...

"This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; for John baptised with water, but you will be baptised with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up towards heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up towards heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."
